I was so impressed that Sapphire, Izzy, Makayla and Atiria were able to write this descriptive piece in four minutes:

He sat there empty and alone. He felt like he had no place to call home, and if he was to return who would be there for him.

Who knew the feeling of losing someone would make you feel so distant. He sat, cold and staring at a sorrowful grave

where she lies abandoned, although peaceful and resting.


