Animal Studies visit to View Bank Cattery & Kennels at Evandale 4th March

Sally, from View Bank, kindly invited the Animal Studies class to spend a day at the Cattery & Kennels. Students were involved with some of the daily routines such as cleaning the cat pens, checking animals & hanging out the washing.

It was a privilege to be with these 7 students who listened to instructions, asked questions and worked hard to get tasks completed. Students worked in pairs with one responsible for cleaning whilst the other acted as security.

In the kennel area students learnt the importance of cleanliness throughout the area and were given the opportunity to wash a couple of the occupants. They learnt about biosecurity and how hands MUST be washed before handling any of the kittens to prevent the spread of possible disease. In the cattery students were involved in the worming of one litter of kittens which started with weighing each individual to determine the dose rate.


A big thanks to Sally, Sam and Jas for their expert guidance and the amazing opportunity to be part of their day.

Helicopters, body organs and microscopes have been the scope of Science this term.




Year 7 Science made paper helicopters early in the term to investigate how variables altered their flight, such as



size and the type of paper, length of blades and weight using paperclips. This lead into forces and learning about what a force is, contact and non-contact forces and force pairs. There have been some great conversations and students have participated well in demonstrations and practical tasks.

The characteristics of life have been investigated by Grade 8 Science. They recognise growth, reproduction, response to stimuli, and having cells as being important factors in determining whether something is alive. They followed the mishaps of Sammy and were able to justify their decision of when he was no longer alive. More recently students have been learning how to use the microscopes, making slides and discovering the amazing world of cells.
