Principals Report

We are very excited to have all Primary (Kinder to Grade 6) and Senior Secondary (Grade 11/12) students returning to onsite learning on Monday. We cannot thank parents and carers enough for your exceptional commitment and effort in ensuring learning has continued at home during this uncertain period.

We will be very pleased on the 9th of June when we have all our students back onsite.

Our School Library will be opening again next week, can students please remember to return any books they have at home and can Primary students please remember to bring their library bags to school.

Whilst there have been many changes to our regular school year, we have a number of very exciting projects underway across the school coming on line over the next few months. Here is a quick summary of some of them.

MDT Automotive Project

This will be our major works project and will provide the school with a specific space to offer Automotive Studies. There will be improvements to existing areas within the Metal work, Wood work and the Arts spaces, levelling and redesign of entries and exits, more covered spaces and a new general learning area. The working group has finalised concepts for Council approval and all going well the build will occur from September with expected completion in February 2021.

Once the plans are ready, we will have them on display for our school community to view.

Toilet & Minor Works Package

This project is almost complete, with formal sign off of this project expected before the end of June 2020. We now have upgraded toilets in the Primary area, the Staff area and our change-rooms in the Gym now have an upgraded shower space.

Animal Handling Shed

Last year we received a Local Schools Community Grant to build an Animal Handling Shed. Plans are currently being prepared for council – we expect building to begin next term.

We look forward to sharing more good news with you during the term.

As our numbers on site increase please help us to keep our site as safe as possible by maintaining physical distancing at drop off and pick up times and please where possible drop off and pick your children up from the outside doors. Please if you or your child are unwell please remain home.

Red Cross Delivered Meals is more than just delivering a nutritious meal, it is also a wellbeing check for our most vulnerable members of our communities.


This is a wonderful opportunity to meet your neighbours and brighten someone's day.




