Reporting

Due to the impact of COVID-19, the Department of Education adjusted mid-year reporting requirements. CTDHS has chosen to provide written reports to all students. 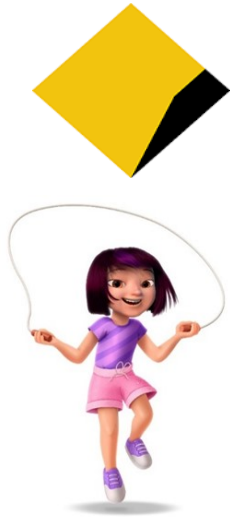

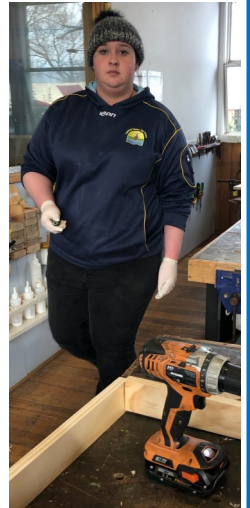
MDT – 11/12

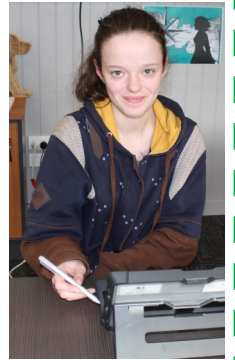
