Principals Report

Growth is one of our school and Department of Education values – *improving by always learning and finding better ways to do things*. I am so proud to see growth across our school, for our learners, our learning programs and for our school community. Below are a couple of snapshots of growth in action in our school community.

On Tuesdays, our Senior Secondary Students have been providing a hot lunch across the school as part of their project implementation course. The hot soups have been enjoyed by all who have ordered them.

In partnership with Greening Australia, our Indigenous students from the Primary School spent Monday this week participating in an Aboriginal Science and Sustainability Day at Lewisham Farm – we are grateful for the amazing learning opportunity this has provided to our students.

Our Primary students have been identifying and developing their personal emotional tools to help them when they are experiencing a rough time. The contributions of our students and the fantastic discussion they participated in last week with Suze from MyTERN showed the growing resilience in our students.

Courage and **aspiration** were certainly on show last week as some of our Primary students attended the Country Gold trials. Well done on representing our school so well – we are very proud of you all. An extra congratulations to the students who were selected in the Country Gold Teams – we wish you all well.

Attendance - Every day counts! Attendance at school gives students opportunities to develop the basic building blocks for learning and achievement. Along with academic success, being at school helps students develop social skills such as friendship building, teamwork, communication skills and healthy self-esteem.

Being absent for more than two days per month can stop children from getting the consistent instruction they need to build on basic skills. Each day of learning builds on the previous day. When children miss a day of school, it can be hard to keep up in following lessons. Also, when they aren't in school, they're missing opportunities to be identified for extra support, as well as extension projects.

Children who are regularly absent from school are at risk of experiencing long-term difficulties with their learning, resulting in fewer educational and employment opportunities. Research consistently shows that students missing more than two days per month are significantly less likely to read at an age appropriate level and much less likely to complete year 12. Also, absenteeism can also make issues of low self-esteem, social isolation and dissatisfaction worse.

All the staff at Campbell Town care about your child and want them to have successful and meaningful futures. We need to see them at school every day so we can help them achieve the best results and build positive relationships with their classmates and teachers. We look forward to seeing everyone at school, every day.

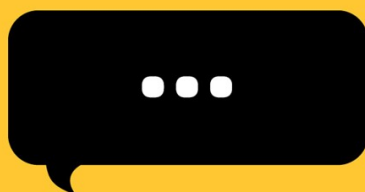

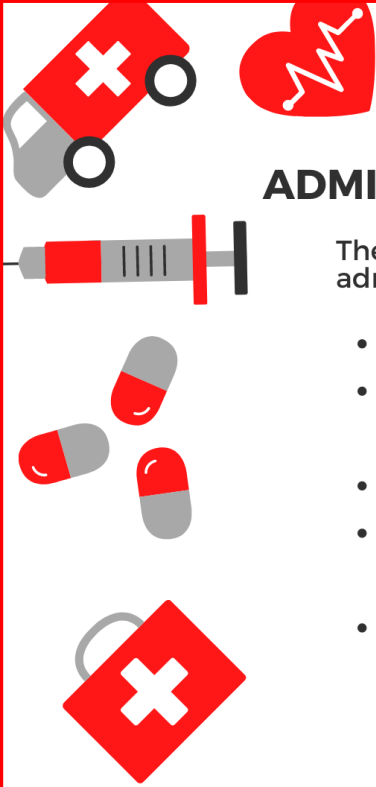

ADMINISTRATION OF STUDENT MEDICATION UPDATE

The Department of Education have recently reviewed procedures for the administration of student medication. Please note the following:

- **All medication** must be supplied in the original container
- **Prescribed medication** must be in the labelled container as dispensed by the pharmacy
- **All medication** must be in date
- **Non-prescribed medication** - A Parent/Guardian must complete the new Form A
- **Prescribed medication** - A Parent/Guardian must complete the new Form A and a Doctor, Pharmacist or practice nurse must complete new Form B
