The Department of Education recently announced that we would be expanding the Student Assistance Scheme for 2021.

Parents who have a current concession card as listed below can apply for dependent students for assistance under the STAS:

Please note that if you are already receiving student assistance you do not need to complete a form.

For 2021 a new on-line form has been developed to assist with processing applications for new applicants.

The form will be available for public use from the 10 November.

Once a validated form is completed the Department of Education will confirm the outcome of your application in writing, this process takes approximately 14 days.

Campbell Town Pedestrian Underpass

Campbell Town Pedestrian Underpass

The local Campbell Town Community have been seeking a solution to provide a safe pedestrian crossing point on the Midland Highway for local school students from Campbell Town District School, as well as patients and residents at the local Campbell Town Health Centre.

The Tasmanian Government has committed to providing an underpass under the Midland Highway from the area between Church and Bridge Streets.

The Tasmanian Government is progressing plans for the Campbell Town Underpass and will be awarding a tender in late 2020 to undertake detailed design work for this project. The underpass is anticipated to be located at the intersection of Bridge Street or Church Street and the Midland Highway, and will exit close to the entrance of the Recreation Ground.

The pedestrian underpass will be 3m in width and will provide access for mobility walkers, prams, wheelchairs and pedestrians. It will be lit to ensure 24 hour access as required.

The detailed design of the project will be considered through a Design and Construct tender, which will be finalised in early 2021. It is anticipated more detailed plans will be available for consideration often this time.

This project is funded jointly by the Australian Government contributing 4.8 million dollars, and the Tasmanian Government contributing 1.2 million dollars.

It is anticipated works will commence on this project in late 2021
